

## Provost's Student Photo Competition Submission Materials

The Office of the Provost is proud to announce the Provost's Student Photo Competition. We hope to celebrate student success and capture the spirit of the University by sourcing submissions that express the artists' interpretation of areas of study across the University. The goal is for the main reception area of the Provost's office to be transformed into a space that celebrates student talent and is an inclusive display of the innovation and excellence that happens in each of our schools and colleges. Undergraduate students are welcome to submit print quality photographs, individual or series, which represent any aspect of the academic disciplines (Agriculture, Health, & Natural Resources; Business; Education; Engineering; Fine Arts; Law; Liberal Arts & Sciences; Nursing; Pharmacy; Social Work; Dental; Medical). Submissions are due via the online submission form located on the Provost's website (<https://provost.uconn.edu/events-and-recognition/provosts-photo-competition/>) **no later than October 17<sup>th</sup>**.

Artwork will be credited and displayed in the lobby of the Provost's Office and winners will receive a one-time scholarship for academic expenses in the following amounts for the Spring 2020 semester:

1<sup>st</sup> place - \$500.00

2<sup>nd</sup> place - \$400.00

3<sup>rd</sup> place - \$300.00

4<sup>th</sup> place - \$100.00 (9 winners)

### Submission Guidelines:

- Only submissions from undergraduate students will be considered. Students must be enrolled in undergraduate course work at the University of Connecticut for the spring 2020 semester.
- All entries must be photographs taken of the University of Connecticut, its surrounding areas, its regional affiliates, or at University-sponsored events.
- Files must be at least 240ppi or 360ppi resolution. Entries should be submitted via the submission form as a JPEG or PNG attachment.
- An individual student may submit more than one photo or series for separate consideration, however, each entry must be submitted in a separate submission form. Students who submit duplicate entries are only eligible to receive one scholarship.
- The photographs must be your own original creations. You must be the sole owner of the copyright of any photograph(s) submitted. Your submission of each photograph is your guarantee that you are the author and copyright holder of such photograph.
- By entering, you warrant that the image does not violate or infringe upon the copyright, trademark, rights of publicity, privacy, or any other intellectual property or other rights of any person or entity.
