3. ECONOMIC MOBILITY

Salary growth, loan debt, generational income growth, current salary range

4. CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

Community involvement, philanthropy, awards/honors/recognition

5. EDUCATIONAL SATISFACTION

Degree preparation, transferable knowledge (general education), disciplinary knowledge (disciplinary education), marketability of major, relationships/networks/mentor(s), faculty/staff influence on success, affinity to school
