- Syllabi can be changed to adapt to online learning
 - The University Senate adopted the following language to increase flexibility, "Since greater flexibility is required for the move to online courses in the spring of 2020, faculty are encouraged to modify their syllabi (methods, assignments, assessments, deadlines, etc.) in accordance with the new modalities, as often as necessary, with as little alteration of the course's learning objectives as possible and to communicate any changes to students as soon and as clearly as possible."

- Students can opt to take classes Pass/Fail
 - The University Senate adopted the following language for Spring 2020, "For the Spring Semester of 2020 only, the following suspensions will be in effect concerning By-Law II.E.3.b: Pass-Fail Option: The individual schools and colleges will determine which courses a student may elect as Pass/Fail and which may count toward majors and minors. General Education courses which the Schools and Colleges adopt as pass/fail will count toward the general education requirements. The 26-credit, scholastic probation, three-course limit, and deadline restrictions are suspended."

- Students are permitted to drop courses up until the last day of classes
 - Utilizing existing language in the University Senate bylaws, "Exceptions [to dropping classes after the first day of class] are made only for extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control."
 - Current circumstances are deemed to be extenuating circumstances beyond the control of all of our students.

- Remote Advising
 - Best practices now necessitate the cancelation of all in-person advising meetings. Advisors may choose the virtual platform they prefer to use in order to best connect with students. Our recommendation is that WebEx and NEXUS may be best suited to manage advising and advising appointments in our new environment.
 - All students will receive a message about FERPA and remote advising via Nexus.

- Undergraduate Research
 - To help undergraduate students and their faculty mentors respond to the suspension of on-campus research activities, the Office of Undergraduate Research has developed an informational webpage on <u>COVID-19 and</u> <u>Undergraduate Research</u> to address common questions and concerns.  - OUR is working with student awardees and their faculty research supervisors to modify their projects given the University's new research parameters. Our goal is to ensure that students receive their funding and a research experience, even if it is a different type of research experience than originally planned. Commencement

- Will be held as a virtual pre-recorded Commencement in May.
- A large Commencement ceremony and activities are being planned for Columbus Day weekend (October 9-11)
- The save the date email to May 2020 undergraduates went out on Friday, March 27. A separate email will be sent to graduate students.
- Diploma covers will be mailed with diplomas for all school/college May 2020 graduates except those in the Medical and Dental schools. UCH is exploring the possibility of having their diplomas shipped with their covers, as well, but additional steps may need to be taken.
- Printed programs are not able to be mailed with diplomas. Printed programs will be edited as noted previously and will be available for distribution beginning May 11, 2020. A quantity of programs will be retained for October activities.
- An update will be provided next week for all school/college communications staff and Commencement
 organizers on instructions for including school/college specific content on this site for May 9 release.

- Consulting
 - The impact of COVID-19 on consulting will be varied, depending on the type of activity that was being undertaken.
 - During the period in which teaching and much of the other operations of UConn are virtual due to COVID-19
 your employee status with the university has not changed. Therefore, the same rules around the amount of
 time that you can consult will be unchanged during this period.
 - Please note that approval to consult does not in any way provide an override to current restrictions by state
 or federal governments that may be in place with regard to travel.
 - If you have an approved consulting activity that is postponed and will now fall outside the dates approved for your consulting request, as per the consulting policy, you <u>must</u> submit a new consulting request which covers the appropriate time period during which the consulting activity will now take place.
 - If you have consulting activity approved which will now be canceled, or you are submitting a new request to cover a postponement, you should <u>reconcile</u> your previous request and mark that the activity did not take place.

- SETs (teaching evaluations) only to be used for personal reflection
 - The University Senate approved the following language, "For the Spring of 2020 only, the University Senate requests that the administration allow individual instructors to decide whether or not SETs should be administered in their courses."
 - Submitted SETs for spring 2020 will **not** be used for any administrative purposes (*i.e.* tenure and promotion decisions).

- Pending: An additional year to be added to the clock for tenure-track faculty
 - Accounts for the disruption in research that many faculty are facing.
 - Similar to FMLA-related extensions in which additional time is provided, but individual faculty may opt to submit their materials on the original timeline.
 - MOA developed with AAUP.
 - Pending Board approval (April 29, 2020).


Summer and Fall Book Orders



Supporting Student Transitions to Remote Online Learning

- Initial wave of interest was technology centric (dealing with access issues) and (how do I teach my students remotely using technology)
 - HuskyCT, WebEx, Blackboard Collaborate, Kaltura
 - Technology test-runs and 'booster session workshops---'need help'
- Next wave (now) will be assessment centric (how do I assess my students remotely using technology)
 - Encouraging faculty to reimagine assessment strategy and methods
 - Automated Proctoring (LockDown Browser with Respondus Monitor)
 - Keep Teaching: Developing and Building Online Assessments in HuskyCT
 - Keep Teaching: Rethinking Assessments in-Person to Online
 - Keep Teaching: Using LockDown Browser and Monitor for Online Tests in HuskyCT
 - Need help series: smaller group hands-on-workshops
