

# Which PTR/PR Form Do I Use?

The AAUP and the University of Connecticut agreed in Article 31 of their collective bargaining agreement to establish a work group to discuss negotiable aspects, if any, of the University's promotion, tenure, and reappointment (PTR) procedures. The work group was comprised of representatives from the AAUP, the University Senate, the Provost's Office, and the Office of Faculty and Staff Labor Relations. An agreement was reached in September 2018. As such, tenure track faculty members should review guidance on the Legacy vs. New PTR form.

Unless specifically opted, most faculty will utilize the New Form. Faculty utilizing the Legacy Form will be permitted to do so until their application for promotion to Professor, during which they will utilize the New Form.

Hired into the tenure track or into a position covered by Article 13 of the AAUP contract on or after August 23, 2018.	<u>New Form</u>
All faculty applying for promotion to Professor	<u>New Form</u>
Hired into the tenure track or into a position covered by Article 13 of the AAUP contract on or before August 22, 2018.	Faculty members applying for tenure and/or promotion to any position other than Professor were afforded the opportunity to continue utilizing the <u>Legacy Form</u> until applying for promotion to Professor or to switch to the <u>New Form</u> .
